

### Definition of Classes

1. In the following Definitions of Classes First Prize wins in Limited Show Obedience Classes and Open Shows confined to one breed do not count for entry Open and Championship Obedience Classes
2. A dog must be entered in the lowest schedules class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in another standard class if desired plus one additional special class if scheduled. Exemptions form this regulation are:- A dog entered in a Good Citizen Scheme Special Pre-Beginner Obedience Stakes Class or a Young Kennel Club (YKC) Obedience Class which may also be entered in a maximum of two other scheduled classes (including YKC classes) for which it is eligible.
3. **Charity Special Class 'C'**: The Charity Special Class 'C' is open to all competing obedience handlers and is based on a normal Class C round, however the appointed judge may vary the content of the exercises should they wish to, provided it is not deemed injurious to the dog/handler. Any variation to the test must be displayed on a "Briefing Sheet" at the ringside prior to commencement of judging. The stake class is held under Kennel Club rules and regulations in force at the time of the show and dogs entered in breach of Kennel Club rules will be disqualified. Once a dog has qualified by winning one of the stake classes, the dog is able to challenge for the title of "Overall Winner" in the "All-Winners Final competition. When a dog has qualified by winning one of the stake classes, that dog is not eligible to compete in further qualifying heats held in the same calendar year. However they are allowed to enter the class "Not for Competition" should they wish to. The title "Overall Winner" is a once in a lifetime title, and a dog that has won this award is never eligible to compete in the competition again.

PRE-BEGINNERS	To compete in Pre-Beginners a handler or dog must not have won a First Prize in either Pre-Beginners or Beginners nor gained a third place or above in any other obedience class
BEGINNERS	To compete in Beginners a handler or dog must not have won a total of two or more First Prizes in Beginners Class or one a First Prize in any other Obedience Class. (Pre-Beginners excepted)
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won two First Prizes in Obedience Classes. (Pre-Beginners and Beginners excepted).
CLASS A	For dogs which have not won three First Prizes in Class A, B and Open C in total
CLASS B	For dogs which have not won three First Prizes in Class B and Open C in total
OPEN CLASS C	At Open Shows, and in the Open C Classes held at Championship shows, open to all dogs
CHARITY SPECIAL 'C'	Open to all competing obedience handlers (see point 3 above)
SPECIAL ABC CLASS	(Anything But a Collie) Open to all dogs other than a Collie, WSD or a Collie X or WSD X (Pre Beginners to C). The aim is to reward attitude, team work and positive handling. Handlers may choose which tests from their lowest eligible class up. No scent or stays.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

These Rules and Regulations are to be read in conjunction with The Kennel Club Obedience Show Regulations G under which this show is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this show to make themselves familiar with the Kennel Club G Regulations, available from the Kennel Club.

- Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with the Kennel Club regulations for Classification and Registration B.
- All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows.
- Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.
- In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members classes or competing for members specials each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the society.
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
- In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
  - (a) in classes without a full running order dogs will be received until 10.30 am after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
  - (b) Where dogs are entered solely in classes with a full running order they will be received at any time. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Timed stays will take place and will take priority over other tests; the times will be published at the show and in the catalogue.
- For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area, must be on a lead except when competing or practising prior to competition.
- Animals allowed in Event – No animal other than the one officially entered shall be brought onto the precincts of the dog show during its continuance, except any dog registered to assist the disabled or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the general committee. However, at the discretion of the show society a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- A dog shall be disqualified and removed from the show if it is: a) – A bitch which is in season. b) – Suffering from infectious or contagious disease. c) – Interfering with the safety or chance of winning an opponent. d) – Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal. e) – Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- No person shall carry out punitive or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
- No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge
- Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- PRIZE MONEY – no prize money will be awarded.
- All offers of sponsorship or donation must be included with the names of the sponsors.
- No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- Dogs in Cars On Hot Days – Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage.
- Welfare of Dogs – An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
- In the event that the venue owner states that the venue grounds are unsuitable for camping for any reason then the club will refund the camping fees, but will not refund or cancel the actual obedience class entry fees.
